Preparing and Submitting Your Abstract for CGIF

We will adhere to a format and style that is recommended by the American Society for Microbiology, which can be reviewed at their website for their Annual General Meetings. Remember that an abstract is only a short description of your work. The reader should be able to easily comprehend the goals and results arising from your research after reading your abstract. We will not accept abstracts that are lacking in terms of meaningful data, and (or) are devoid of conclusions and interpretative statements. Avoid using phrases such as: "the results will be described in the poster" or "we await the final analyses of samples collected". A template of an acceptable abstract follows:

Body of abstract:

Limit the body of the abstract to 2,000 characters (excluding spaces) and do not include the title in this count. Do not use tabs or line spacing for paragraph formatting. Do not use graphics or tables functions. Any numerical values should be provided in the body of the text and not as a table. Please use other functions as required such as italics, super- and subscript keys, and other symbols. Please save and submit your abstract in .rtf format.

Keywords:

Please provide 3-5 words as keywords for your abstract. List these at the end of the abstract, separated by a line.
